#### **Education**

### Online and remote education (England)

The DfE has recently published an updated edition of their non-statutory guidance <a href="Providing remote education: guidance for schools">Providing remote education: guidance for schools</a>, including new material on supporting children with special educational needs or disabilities and with links to our page on making online learning accessible to deaf children.

### SEND review improvement plan (England)

The Department for Education has set out its plans to improve the SEND system, following their SEND review consultation last year. It includes a commitment to ensuring there are sufficient Teachers of the Deaf and to reviewing the supply of these. Our <u>initial analysis</u> of the improvement plan sets out our thoughts overall.

### **Cross-border commissioning (England)**

We've developed a <u>position paper</u> setting out our views on the cross-border commissioning of specialist education services and provision for deaf children.

### Parliamentary event in Westminster (England)

Term and Year: Spring 2023 (2)



At the end of February, we headed to Parliament in Westminster. Almost 30 MPs popped in to see us and it was fantastic to talk to them face-to-face about the barriers deaf children face in education.

We raised the urgent need to invest in more Teachers of the Deaf and why the British Sign Language GCSE must be available in schools as soon as possible.

We were also joined by deaf young people and parents who shared their own experiences with parliamentarians. Watch a short video of the event here.

### Education Policy Institute report on deaf children's outcomes (England)

The EPI report takes an in-depth look at deaf children's educational outcomes between 2011 and 2019. Our blog provides a summary of its key findings.

### **Emotional Well-being Survey of Deaf Children and Young People**

Last year, we surveyed deaf young people to find out more about their mental health and well-being and to see what comparisons we could make with other children, drawing from the Good Childhood Index. <u>Our report</u> summarises the findings.

### **Baby Soundscapes project**

UCL have published a <u>summary</u> of their forthcoming report *Understanding the sound environments of babies and toddlers*. It recommends that, providing families receive good guidance on effective use, radio aids can be beneficial for deaf children under the age of 18 months.
